Yateley Neighbourhood Watch work closely with the Neighbourhood Policing team in a combined effort to reduce crime in the local area. Currently there are 105 streets covered by the scheme, and the list is continually growing. Neighbourhood Watch is run by volunteers and is not owned or managed by the police. Neighbourhood watch is a non-profit scheme.

I) Our current project that we hope to achieve, is to fund the purchase of a projector and screen, thus providing the opportunity for guest speakers to enhance their presentations. (Frequently requested)

II) The acquisition of which will also be particularly advantageous to Yateley Neighbourhood Watch - For our meetings, we can create added informative interest by way of 'Power Point' presentations and area maps that can be referred to and discussed collectively.

III) Also, If the sum of £500 Grant Aid is approved, part of this will be set-aside in order to make possible payments (to cover their costs etc) to guest speakers, therefore giving us a greater and broader scope regarding choice of speakers.

IV) We will also embark upon a new recruitment drive to increase the number of Yateley streets covered by Neighbourhood Watch. This will require the production and purchase of new flyers for distribution to residents.
